Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2025 Charity — Creating happiness through running —

The Tokyo Marathon Foundation Charity RUN with HEART will conduct charity activities at the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2025, scheduled on Sunday, October 19, 2025. We are looking for charity runners who can work with us to think about how we can promote sports, and support environmental conservation, refugees, sick children and animal welfare, among others, through the half marathon and other events, as well as share our initiatives with the world.

1. 24 recipient programs (organizations) conducting the charity program

24 recipient organizations are set to participate in undertakings that promote sports and support environmental conservation, refugees, sick and impoverished children and animal welfare.

2. How to participate the charity

There are two ways to participate.

- ① Donate 50,000 JPY or more and be a charity runner.
- ② Donation only: 1,000 JPY or more (from minimum amount set by each recipient organizations)

You can apply through the recipient organizations' websites.

*Each recipient organization's websites will open Friday, April 25 at 11:00 a.m.

3. Schedule

Friday, April 25, 11:00 a.m. to Friday, May 23, 5:00 p.m.

Recipient organizations will be start collecting donations and recruiting charity runners.

*Charity runner applications will close when the maximum number is reached.

4. Examples from the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2025 Charity (Tokyo Marathon Foundation Sports Legacy Program)

Last year, a para-athletics class was held in the Japan National Stadium in conjunction with the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2024 on the day of the race, Sunday, October 20.

The purpose of these classes is to provide opportunities for people with all kinds of disabilities to come to the grounds of the Japan National Stadium, a sacred place for athletes, and to experience the excitement and emotion of athletes, nurturing their future growth and inspiring them to reach for new dreams. Following on from last year, we expanded the scope of the classes, opening some to everyone, regardless of whether or not they have a disability, and we increased the number of people who could participate. The classes were taught by highly experienced coaches and athletes.

【Japan Committee, Vaccines for the World's Children】

The Japan Committee, Vaccines for the World's Children provides vaccination assistance by supplying vaccines to children in developing countries, helping to protect their future. When the Committee was first formed, every day 8,000 children lost their lives to infectious diseases such as polio or tetanus. Through widespread vaccination efforts around the world, this figure has been cut in half over the past 30 years to 4,000 children a day. However, this means that even now, a tiny, precious life is lost every 20 seconds. Infectious diseases are still major threats to children's lives in developing countries. In FY2024, the Committee supplied vaccines and related equipment to children in Myanmar, Laos, Bhutan, and Vanuatu. It continues to actively work to protect as many lives as it can from infectious diseases.

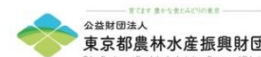

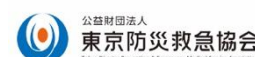

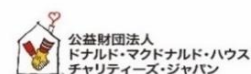
