

**Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2024 Charity**  
**Total donations reached 28,633,916 yen**  
**Thank you to everyone who supported and donated.**

Donations for the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2024 Charity closed on Friday, May 24, 2024, and over 26 million yen were collected. Donations will be used for the projects (organizations) selected by the donors to promote sports and support environmental conservation, refugees, sick and impoverished children, and animal welfare.

In addition, ONE TOKYO Premium Members and general entrants were asked to donate 500 yen as disaster relief for the Noto Peninsula Earthquake on January 1, 2024. In the end, 5,191 runners participated, and a total of 2,595,500 yen was raised.

Runners who donated will have "能登のために" (#ForNoto) stamped on their athlete bibs. Donations collected will be sent to the Donation Distribution Committee of the disaster-stricken areas via the Japanese Red Cross Society as disaster relief funds.
