Under the concept of "Let's Convert Your Love for Running into Someone's Happiness," Tokyo Marathon Foundation Charity RUN with HEART conducts charity activities through the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2026.

From Wednesday, April 15 to Friday, May 15, 2026, donation applications and Charity Runner entries were accepted. A record-breaking total of 55,559,831 yen was donated to 25 Recipient Programs working to address various social issues, including sports promotion, environmental conservation, refugee assistance, support for children with serious illnesses, poverty relief, and animal welfare.

Furthermore, as a new initiative for this event, we launched "+ONE Action," which allows people to participate by making a donation starting from 500 yen. This initiative aims to foster a culture of giving in Japan and create opportunities for more people to easily participate in charity.

Through "+ONE Action," runners selected one of the following three organizations during registration based on the causes they wished to support. A total of 7,738 donations were made, amounting to 3,869,000 yen.

- Donations for the 2024 Noto Peninsula Earthquake Relief
- Nationwide Children's Cafeteria Support Center – Musubie
- Ashinaga Foundation

The bibs of runners participating in "+ONE Action" will feature the message, "Let the spirit of '+ONE' fuel your run." Carrying the thoughts and intentions behind their donations, these runners will take part in the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2026. Combined, the total amount of donations raised through the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon 2026 Charity reached 59,428,831 yen. The donations received will be used to support activities undertaken by the respective Recipient Programs to address various social issues.

■ **"Sports Legacy Program" Utilizing Donations**

The Tokyo Marathon Foundation operates the Sports Legacy Program as one of its initiatives utilizing donations.

At the Tokyo Legacy Half Marathon, we are committed to creating a legacy for the future through sports. As part of these efforts, we host the Para Athletics Class to provide individuals with disabilities with opportunities to experience the joy of sports and physical activity at MUFG STADIUM (Japan National Stadium).
